Visitor Liaison

The Centre exists to support people from 5 years of age with disabilities and special needs, including those with multiple and profound learning disabilities, physical and mental disabilities, those recovering from stroke or other serious ailments, the elderly and those affected by dementia.

We improve mental and physical health with activities that interact with our farm animals and horticultural areas. We are home for horses, donkeys, goats, pigs, sheep, rabbits, ducks, turkeys, chickens and guinea pigs. We work within the following areas: horse riding, animal care and management, horticulture, gardening, work experience, not for profit tea room, community hub, organic vegetables, sensory garden and nature areas. We work with and support disability groups, care homes, day centres, schools and individuals.

Tasks/ responsibilities:	 Meet and greet our beneficiaries on their arrival to the centre ensuring a warm welcome Help our visitors to commence and engage with their planned activities (planned/ organised activities can be animal care and welfare tasks, gardening or horticultural tasks) Ensure the health and safety of visitors at all times We encourage interaction with the animals and hands on farm work which can be physically demanding Work is tailored to individual abilities and includes clearing 'poo'
	from the fields, mucking out, grooming, cleaning and feeding (We offer the opportunity to also become involved in the gardening scheme)

	9:30am and 1pm on a Monday, Tuesday, Thursday or Friday 9:30am and 2:30pm on a Wednesday

Skills/ attributes required:	Volunteers need to be 16 years or over There is no upper age limit You need a calm manner and an ability to maintain personal boundaries You require a warm and empathetic manner, you will be liaising with beneficiaries Must have a willingness to get stuck in and participate in activities as necessary Working conditions can be hard work particularly in bad weather and recalcitrant animals Conditions are dirty, smelly and muddy underfoot in certain areas It would be useful to be comfortable with large animals but not essential No experience needed for carrying out the planned activities or jobs as full training will be provided No experience needed for the animal care tasks as full training will be provided
